  - a. If you have already applied or if you have already been admitted, you may submit the scholarship application.
  - b. Please attach a personal statement (referred to on the last page of the scholarship application). If you believe the personal statement submitted along with your application for admission addresses the prompt, then submit a copy of that document along with this application.
