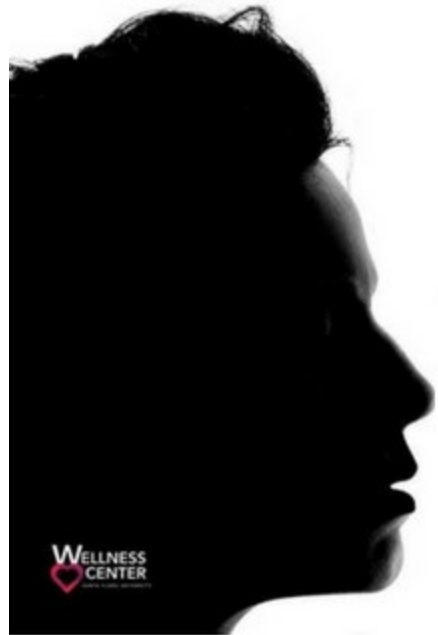

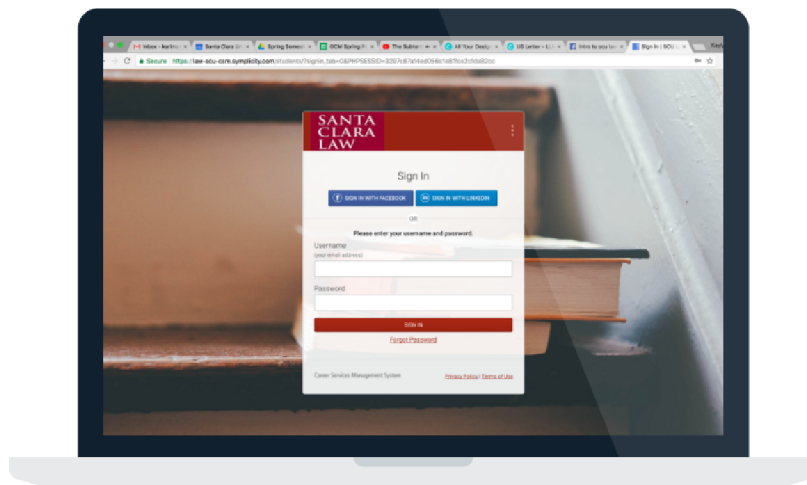

Rosa Tsongtaatarii is a **Senior Deputy City Attorney** with the City of San Jose Office of the City Attorney. She advises the Environmental Services Department on program and contractual issues related to sanitary sewer services and integrated waste management; and other municipal issues.

She has been practicing municipal law since 2002, and is a graduate of Santa Clara Law School, with a Bachelor of Science from UC Berkeley in Molecular Cell Biology and Interdisciplinary Studies (Public Health Policy).

Kevin Hammon has been a lawyer in the **Santa Clara County Counsel's** Child Dependency Unit. Kevin worked in the County Counsel's Litigation Unit between 2007 and 2008. Between 2004 and 2007, Kevin was a litigation attorney at McManis Faulkner.

Micaél "Mica" Estremera is a trial lawyer from East San Jose. Since graduating from Santa Clara University School of Law, he has practiced complex civil litigation at Thelen, impact litigation in the Santa Clara County Counsel's office, and criminal defense as a **deputy public defender** in Santa Clara County.

Joanna Lee is currently a **Deputy District Attorney** in Santa Clara County. She graduated from UCLA in 2008 and from UC Hastings College of the Law in 2012. She then started her career prosecuting general misdemeanor crimes. She has been part of the Misdemeanor, Family Violence, General Felonies and now the North County Felony Unit.

Moderated by* **Justice Mihara currently sits on the **California Court of Appeal, 6th App.** District. Prior to appointment to the court, Justice Mihara had a private law practice in Menlo Park until he joined the California State Attorney General's office as a Deputy AG in San Francisco. Justice Mihara holds a J.D. from UC Hastings College of Law.
