

Council of Leaders Meeting Minutes

September 14, 2016

Agenda Item 1: Welcome and Update from Dean Kloppenberg

Dean Kloppenberg provided a general update of the Law School including the new building. She then opened it to the floor for concerns, which included cuts to the budget and the effects of the food ban on the LSO's. The audience discussed the difficulty of obtaining funding for specific food items, and also expressed some concern about the emphasis on High-Tech and the lack of equal focus on Social Justice.

Agenda Item 2: Miguel – Proposal to Alter the Budget Allocation for the Advocate

One of the proposals for vote on the next Board of Governors' meeting (Monday 9/19) is to alter the funding of the Advocate (for this year only), which would free up more money for the LSO's. In exchange, the SBA would fund the Advocate approximately \$100. The understanding is the School Administration would then fund an additional \$800. This would cause a loss of funding to the Advocate, approximately \$5,000, based on the constitutionally set funding amount. (The estimated loss includes the funding from the School Administration.) The Advocate will also have to convert entirely to digital. It was stated that the bulk of the budget for the Advocate last year, approximately \$4,200, was spent on printing supplies and food. The Constitution requires a 2/3 majority of the Board of Governors to alter the funding of the Advocate.

Agenda Item 3: Welcoming the New Representatives

We welcomed the new representatives to the Board of Governors, and then discussed the method of assigning them to the various committees. We will have an orientation for our representatives TBD.

Agenda Item 4: Proposal for Voting Methodology

Proposal was made that for all votes regarding financial matters and/or the budget shall be required to take place publicly. The proposal was approved by a majority vote.


