Fall 2012 Social Justice Diversity Lecture

Jerry Kang is professor of law at University of California, Los Angeles, and the inaugural Korea Times-Hankook Ilbo Chair in Korean American Studies. A magna cum laude graduate of Harvard College (physics) and the Harvard Law School, Professor Kang writes on race and communications, and their intersection. On race, he is one of the leading legal experts on implicit bias and stereotype threat. He has helped launch the interdisciplinary “behavioral realism” movement, which calls on the law to be more responsive to what the mind sciences have revealed about human behavior, especially in the context of interracial interactions.
