FROM THE EDITOR:



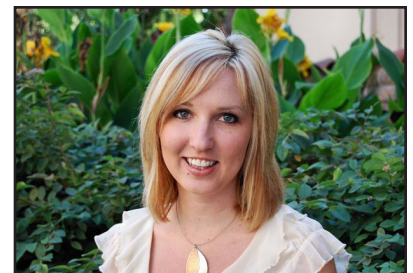

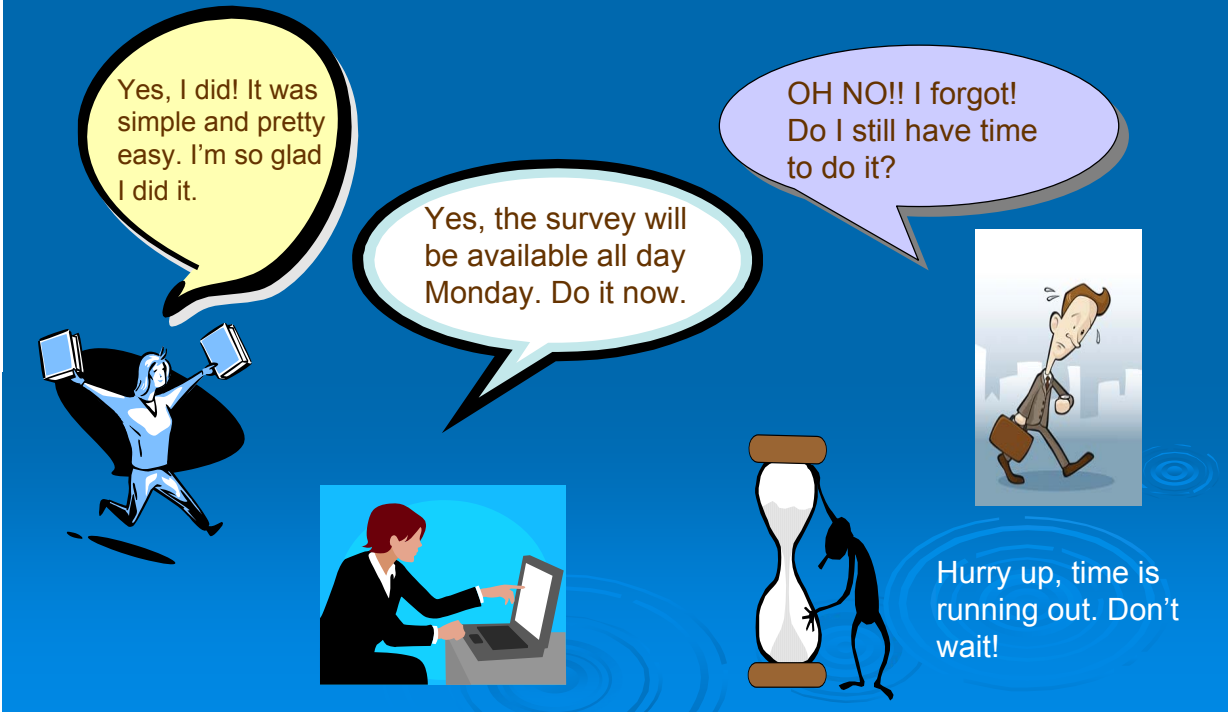
