Language Requirements	<p>All international applicants are required to demonstrate a minimum level of English language proficiency. Proficiency is generally demonstrated by either:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Earned a degree in Australia, Anglophone Canada, Ireland, New Zealand, the United Kingdom, or the United States within the last 4 years where the sole instruction was English, OR2. Proficiency exams. See scores and FAQs, below.<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ TOEFL iBT (90)○ IELTS (6.5)○ Duolingo (120) <p>Occasionally and by prior agreement we allow exchange students from trusted partner schools with a history of sufficient proficiency to waive the language proficiency documentation. These waivers are not available for "Exchange to LLM" students.</p> <p>English proficiency requirements can be found here.</p>

An official Letter of Good Standing from your current law school. 4. A letter of permission to visit Santa Clara University School of Law from your current law school. 5. A complete official English language transcript from your current law school and from the university you previously attended. 6. English Language Proficiency Documentation 7. Photograph 8. <u>For LLMs: Need to also apply through LSAC.</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Create an LLM account with LSAC (Law School Admission Council). • Purchase the LLM Document Assembly Service and arrange to have your official transcripts sent to LSAC for inclusion in your report. You must also submit your English proficiency documentation. Letters of recommendation are not required, but may be submitted for inclusion in your report. Please be aware that processing of your documents takes approximately two weeks, so please complete this process as soon as possible. • Apply to the LLM program electronically from your LSAC account or by using the “Apply Now” link found at https://llm.lsac.org/login/access.aspx?appl=4851L2. Use the application which reflects the term you will begin the LLM portion of your program. This will be the semester after your exchange term. The application deadline is April 15 for the spring LLM term and September 15 for the fall LLM term. You do not have to wait until your LLM-CAS file is complete before submitting your application, but we will be unable to review your application until we receive your LLM-CAS report.

To support these requirements and the health and safety of our international students and exchange visitors, all international students in F-1 or J-1 status are automatically enrolled in and charged for the SCU Student Health Insurance Plan. • The SCU Student Health Insurance Plan costs approximately \$3700 for the year (students who are in the U.S. for one semester are charged a prorated amount). • Students should carefully consider the cost of insurance when budgeting for their study abroad experience. • <u>Enrollment in the SCU Student Health Insurance Plan is mandatory. There are no exceptions.
