Language Requirements	All international applicants are required to demonstrate a minimum level of English language proficiency. Proficiency is generally demonstrated by either: 1. Earned a degree in Australia, Anglophone Canada, Ireland, New Zealand, the United Kingdom, or the United States within the last 4 years where the sole instruction was English, OR 2. Proficiency exams. See scores and FAQs, below. TOEFL iBT (90) IELTS (6.5) Duolingo (120) Occasionally and by prior agreement we allow exchange students from trusted partner schools with a history of sufficient proficiency to waive the language proficiency documentation. These waivers are not available for "Exchange to LLM" students. English proficiency requirements can be found here.

Health Insurance requirements	 Comprehensive health insurance is required by the U.S. government as well as Santa Clara University policy. To support these requirements and the health and safety of our international students and exchange visitors, all international students in F-1 or J-1 status are automatically enrolled in and charged for the SCU Student Health Insurance Plan. The SCU Student Health Insurance Plan costs approximately \$3700 for the year (students who are in the U.S. for one semester are charged a prorated amount). Students should carefully consider the cost of insurance when budgeting for their study abroad experience. Enrollment in the SCU Student Health Insurance Plan is mandatory. There are no exceptions.
