Daniel Suvor serves as Chief of Policy for California Attorney General Kamala D. Harris. As the primary legal policy advisor, he is responsible for developing and executing the Attorney General's policy initiatives and supervises the department's most difficult and high-profile matters. Prior to this appointment, he served at the White House as Senior Director in the Office of Cabinet Affairs where he coordinated logistics, communications and policy between the President and his domestic cabinet agencies. He also managed the day-to-day efforts of President Obama's *My Brother's Keeper* initiative which aims to keep boys and young men of color on track to meet their full potential. He served as Assistant General Counsel of the White House Office of Management and Budget, as a litigation attorney for the Centers for Medicaid & Medicaid Services and as Special Assistant to the General Counsel of HHS.

Daniel also worked for the Obama for America campaign and former Governor Bill Richardson of New Mexico.

Daniel holds a B.A. from the University of Southern California and a J.D. from George Washington University Law School, where he completed a joint program with New College, Oxford University, UK.
