U.S. and International Headlines:

- Democrats Try to Heal Rifts. Pass \$2 Trillion Spending Bill: Party leaders, centrists, progressives need to stay mostly united to approve big piece of Biden agenda this week
- Inflation Surge Whips Up Market Froth: Low inflation-adjusted returns on government bonds is driving investors to riskier corners of the market
- <u>'Ghost Guns': Firearm Kits Bought Online Fuel Epidemic of Violence</u>: They are untraceable, assembled from parts and can be ordered by gang members, felons and even children. They are increasingly the lethal weapon of easy access around the U.S., but especially California.
- Judge Rejects Trump's Bid to Keep Papers Secret in Jan. 6 Inquiry: But a Trump lawyer has signaled an intent to appeal the ruling, which raises novel issues about an ex-president's executive privilege powers.
- <u>Can Self-Defense Laws Stand Up to a Country Awash in Guns?</u>: The Kyle Rittenhouse and Ahmaud Arbery cases raise intriguing legal questions about people who take the law into their own hands and then claim self-defense when someone dies.

- Other Barks & Bites for Friday, November 12: NIH to File Suit Challenging Moderna's Patent Ownership, EU General Court Affirms Massive Google Fine, and US Government Warns Tech Companies About IP Risks in EU's Digital Markets Act: Updates in intellectual property law for the week!
- CAFC Vacates TTAB Finding of No Fraud on the USPTO, Citing Two Legal Errors: An applicant's
 assertion that it has attained the status of recognition as the source of goods carrying a given
 mark is not undermined only by uses made by another person that has attained that status for
 itself.
- WIPO Report Shows Economic Resilience During Pandemic, Buoyed by Massive Numbers of Chinese Patent, Trademark Filings: China received the most trademark application filings during 2020, at 9.35 million, an increase of 19.3% over 2019's totals.... Much of the global increase in 2020's patent filings was spurred by China, which received nearly 1.5 million patent applications last year, an increase of 6.9% over 2019's filing totals.
- <u>Cloudflare Tests Limits of Contributory Copyright Infringement</u>: There is no Ninth Circuit loophole that allows service providers to knowingly host and distribute infringing content without incurring contributory liability.
- Judge Upholds UK Power to Set FRAND Terms: This decision, which may now be appealed, confirms the UK as a forum for resolving FRAND disputes, it is likely to be welcomed by SEP owners but will increase concerns among implementers about the long arm of the UK courts.
- Massie Introduces Bill to Repeal PTAB, Abrogate Alice: Representative Thomas Massie (R-KY) on November 5 introduced a bill, titled the Restoring America's Leadership in Innovation Act of 2021 (RALIA), HR 5874, that would repeal the Patent Trial and Appeal Board (PTAB), return the patent system to a "first-to-invent" model, rather than first-to-file, and would end automatic publication of patents.
