



- Multiple Dead After Driver Plows S.U.V. Into Holiday Parade in Wisconsin: Officials said dozens of people were struck after the vehicle sped down the street during the parade in Waukesha, Wis., near Milwaukee.
- As Hopes for Nuclear Deal Fade, Iran Rebuilds and Risks Grow: With Iran's new administration
 preparing for its first international nuclear negotiations, there are signs that there will be no going
 back to the 2015 agreement.



- FDA Resists FOIA Request for Vaccine Approval Info as Biden Administration Offers to Share it with the World: At this very moment, the Biden Administration is supporting a radical proposal by the governments of India and South Africa to waive patent and trade secret rights relating to COVID-19 vaccines. Yet, the Biden Administration itself is telling a federal district court judge that it is not feasible to release documents relating to the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine approval.
- Tarantino 'Pulp Fiction Dispute Spotlights the Contentious Relationship between NFTs and IP Rights:


