- Affluent, Anxious and Almost Normal: A Journey Through Merkel's Germany: As Angela Merkel
 prepares to step down after 16 years as chancellor of Germany, she leaves behind a country
 profoundly changed and anxious about changing more.
- America's Need to Pay Its Bills Has Spawned a Political Game: Republicans and Democrats have
 long sparred over raising the debt ceiling. But this time, the odds are growing that the U.S. could
 default.
- Supreme Court observers see trouble ahead as public approval of justices erodes
- <u>Today's kids will live through three times as many climate disasters as their grandparents, study</u> says
- House Budget Dems approve unfinished \$3.5T social spending plan: The House Budget
 Committee approved Democrats' \$3.5 trillion spending plan on Saturday night, preparing the
 measure for floor action even as Democratic leaders struggle to finalize bill text that can pass
 both chambers.

IP headlines this week:

- Other Barks & Bites for Friday, September 24: Albright Admonished Again by CAFC; Senate IP Subcommittee Moves Patent Bills Forward: Tillis Questions Google and Facebook on Ad-Supported Piracy: Updates in intellectual property law for the week!
- Looming Leahy Bill Would End Fintiv Practice at PTAB: The bill would thus require any decision by the Director to be issued in a separate written opinion. "The public will therefore be aware which decisions are being made by PTAB judges and which are being made by a politically appointed and accountable Director," explains the draft.
- Allegedly 'Late' Disclosure of IP Rights to ETSI Does Not Make Patents Unenforceable in the US or UK: Two recent court decisions in the United States and the United Kingdom, respectively, have considered (i) the disclosure obligation pursuant to Clause 4.1 of the European Telecommunications Standards Institute's (ETSI) Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) Policy, and (ii) the impact this has on the enforceability of a patent subject to the Policy.
- <u>USPTO Moves Ahead with Changes to Patent Bar Registration</u>: The proposals will generally change the criteria for sitting for the registration examination by: "(1) Adding common Category B degrees to Category A, (2) accepting advanced degrees (i.e., master's and doctor of philosophy degrees) under Category A, and (3) accepting a combination of core sciences under Category B, Options 2 and 4, so long as one of the core science courses has a lab component."
- Third Circuit Joins Sister Courts in Ruling TTAB Decisions May Not Have Preclusive Effect: "[T]he
 jurisdictional limits on the TTAB that accompany its role as the primary venue for narrow questions
 of trademark registration ensure that proceedings before it do not carry claim preclusive effect
 against subsequent Article III infringement proceedings under section 43(a)."


