U.S. and International Headlines:

- <u>Back on the Bench, the Supreme Court Faces a Blockbuster Term</u>: The court, which is dominated by six Republican appointees, will confront a charged docket, including a case asking it to overrule Roe v. Wade.
- In Alaska's Covid Crisis, Doctors Must Decide Who Lives and Who Dies: Amid the nation's worst Covid-19 outbreak, patients are trapped in remote communities and doctors are prioritizing treatment based on who is most likely to survive.
- The Facebook Whistleblower, Frances Haugen, Says She Wants to Fix the Company, Not Harm It: The former Facebook employee says her goal is to help prompt change at the social-media giant
- Mortgage Payments Are Getting More and More Unaffordable: Record growth in home prices is
 erasing savings typically delivered by low interest rates
- <u>Skateboards, Climate Change and Freedom: Germany's Next-Generation Parliament</u>: A new generation of lawmakers is entering Germany's Parliament. They felt ignored by the previous government, so they set out to change that by winning elections.

 <u>Hearing EU Patent Cases in Mid-2022</u>: Updates in intellectual property law for the week!
- Federal Circuit Slams USPTO for Granting Ex Parte Reexam to Serial IPR Filer: The U.S. Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit (CAFC) ruled today in a precedential opinion that Alarm.com, which was denied institution on three inter partes review (IPR) petitions it filed against patents owned by Vivint, Inc., could not simply "repackage" arguments raised in its IPR petition to challenge the same patent via ex parte reexamination.
- <u>CAFC Clarifies Willful Infringement Standard, Reinstating Jury Verdict and Enhanced Damages for SRI International</u>: To eliminate the confusion created by our reference to the language 'wanton, malicious, and bad-faith' in Halo, we clarify that it was not our intent to create a heightened requirement for willful infringement.
- Third Circuit: Facebook Not Immune to Right of Publicity Claims Under IP Carve-Out of Section 230: Because trademark and the right to publicity are analogues, the legal definition including trademark also supports including the right of publicity as 'intellectual property'.


