Update from SuperDraft:

There is a SOBA form online that you need to fill out if you are an LSO that wants money for club events. The link has been sent out and it is due August 31st.

This year's budget is \$15,000 for the academic year. The Advocate receives \$500 for the academic year, and the 30% of the budget is for SBA. The remaining 70% is dedicated to the LSOs and split into two budget periods, Fall and Spring. The final fall budget amount for LSOs to request funds is **\$5,075**.

October 5th is the Administrative Exam Reschedule Request Deadline....

Please take the time to review your exam dates and times. **October 5** is the **LAST** day to request a reschedule for an administrative exam conflict. Ask yourself . . .

- do I have 2 exams on the same day?
- do I have 2 exams back to back i.e. one at 6 pm and one the next morning at 9:00 am?

If the answer to either of these questions is YES, then you have a deadline of **FRIDAY, OCTOBER 5, 2018** to request an Administrative Conflict Reschedule. You must complete the reschedule <u>request form on-line</u>. (http://emery.scu.edu/students/student-services/forms/)

Requests received after this date for Administrative Conflicts will not be approved.
