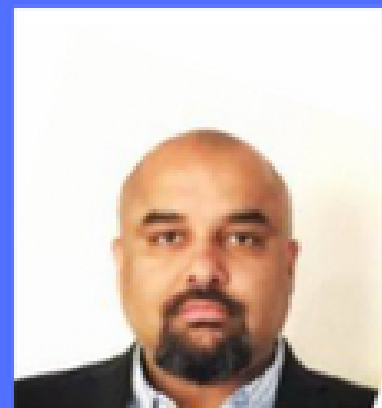

He is a lawyer and coordinator of the Justice Sector Secretariat, where, among other things, he manages relations with public and private stakeholders in the fields of reconciliation and private mediation. He previously managed a community service program to reduce prison sentences for perpetrators and founded an organization to coordinate services to genocide survivors. His project focuses on U.S. restorative justice practices and advancing professionalism in mediation.
