Lori Andrews is a Distinguished Professor of Law, Chicago-Kent College of Law and Director of the Institute for Science, Law and Technology, Illinois Institute of Technology. She teaches a course on the law of social networks. She has taught at Princeton, written for a television legal drama, and served as the chair of the federal advisory committee to the Human Genome Project. She's written ten non-fiction books and three mysteries. In 2008, the *American Bar Association Journal* listed her as a "Newsmaker of the Year—a lawyer with a literary bent who has the scientific chops to rival any CSI investigator." Lori received her B.A. *summa cum laude* from Yale College and her J.D. from Yale Law School.
