

Professor Eric E. Johnson University of North Dakota School of Law

Eric E. Johnson is an associate professor of law at the University of North Dakota School of Law. His primary scholarly interests are intellectual property and media/entertainment law, with a special interest in "new media." Eric is the author of three blogs – Blog Law Blog, Pixelization, and The Backbencher. Intellectual property sharing is a particular interest of Eric's, and his Konomark project aims to facilitate the sharing of copyrighted works on the internet.

Eric received his J.D. from Harvard Law School, and he practiced with the Los Angeles firm of Irell & Manella, where his clients included Paramount, MTV, CBS, Touchstone, and Immersion Corporation. Eric later worked as in-house counsel to Fox Cable Networks.

Outside of his legal career, Eric was a top-40 radio disc jockey and a stand-up comic. In the mid-1990s, he was a consultant at an early-stage internet start-up, and in 2005, he was awarded a patent on a headrest he invented for patients suffering from Parkinson's disease.
