Cheryl B. Preston, Edwin M. Thomas Professor of Law at the J. Reuben Clark Law School, Brigham Young University, teaches contracts, business associations, commercial law, Internet regulation, legal theory, and gender and law.

Before teaching, Professor Preston clerked for Hon. Monroe G. McKay of the United States Court of Appeals for the Tenth Circuit in Denver. She was in private practice for ten years with O'Melveny and Myers in Los Angeles, Holme Roberts and Owen in Salt Lake City. Professor Preston is a member of the ALI, and has been involved in the AALS and with the Noncommercial Users Constituency of ICANN.

Professor Preston publishes in the fields of global Internet governance; pornography regulation and children's rights online; law and religion; and feminist legal theory, especially the role of cultural images in creating barriers to women's success.
