**CGLP Special Speaker:**

**William Hernandez  
LGBT Activist from El Salvador**

**"Human Rights for LGBTQ in El Salvador  
under the FMLN Revolutionary Party"**



William Hernandez is the head of a gay and lesbian organization in El Salvador called the *Asociacion Entre Amigos* – the Between Friends Association. This group has spoken out about human rights violations against LGBT people and the failure of authorities to investigate such abuses.

The outlook for gay rights in El Salvador remains bleak. LGBT people in El Salvador regularly face attacks and intimidation. The *Asociacion Entre Amigos* has reported seven raids on its offices during the last five years.

By speaking out on behalf of LGBT rights, William Hernandez has made himself a target of police harassment. He has been subjected to repeated death threats. The gay rights wing of Amnesty International selected him for its Greeting Card Campaign, which urges people to send messages of support to 25 people around the world who are victims of human rights abuses.

## First Year Students: How to Register for Winter 2011

### TO DO THE WEEK OF OCTOBER 25TH :

- ⇒ Log on to E-Campus on your appointment day and time and register. The system will not let you register until your appointment time. For instructions on using E-Campus, go to <https://www.scu.edu/ecampus/students/upload/student-center.pdf>
- ⇒ NOTE: You do NOT have to register yourself for your Spring 2011 classes. Law Student Services will do that for you *after* the Winter registration period.
- ⇒ Problems: If you are have difficulty using the registration application, contact Law Student Services at 408-554-4766 for assistance. After hours, leave a message or e-mail [lawstudentervices@scu.edu](mailto:lawstudentervices@scu.edu)
- ⇒ You can only register for one 1-unit class. If the class you wish to add is full, follow the directions to add your name to the wait list. You can then register for an alternate class if you wish. NOTE: you are only eligible for the 3 introductory classes. You are not eligible for the advanced classes.

## Don't Buy Those Plane Tickets Yet! Check your Exam Schedule First!

The Fall 2010 exam period runs from December 1-17. Check the exam schedule on ClaraNet to find the exact dates of your exams. Do not make any travel or vacation plans during this time period. The Law School will not reschedule finals due to travel plans. Exams will be rescheduled only for "extraordinary and compelling reasons beyond the student's control." Please, please, please write your exam dates on your calendar and do not schedule *anything* during your exam period.

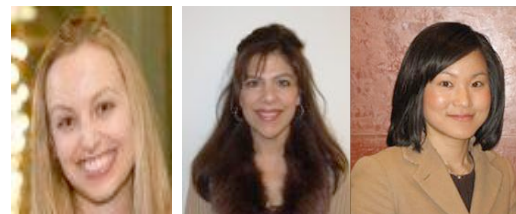

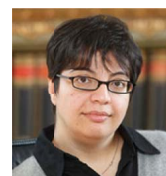

Shadi Sadr, a well-known Iranian human rights lawyer,  
will address the circumstances faced by women  
and others under the current government.

The Alexander Prize recipient this year is **Shadi Sadr**, an Iranian lawyer who has risked her life in her efforts to protect the human rights of women activists and journalists. She has been arrested, beaten and imprisoned in Iran. In July 2009 she was arrested once again and then released, which allowed her to escape to Germany. On May 17, 2010, Ms. Sadr was convicted *in absentia* in a Tehran court of "acting against national security and harming public order" and was sentenced to six years in prison with 74 lashes.

Ms. Sadr has touched the lives of thousands of individuals through the entities she has established and her support of campaigns such as "End Stoning Forever." She founded the website "Women in Iran" and was the director of Raahi, a legal center for women which has since been closed. Ms. Sadr exemplifies the courage and self-sacrifice required of Alexander Prize recipients.
